DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Sorensen stated the proposed assessment agreement with Constellation Energy will run through tax year 2027. There will be no tax objections or protests. The park district will receive the exact agreed trigger amount of \$2,091,858.

The removal of dead trees and overhanging branches at the playground and along the fence line has been completed.

The Santa's Shindig and Tree Lighting events had a good turnout. Dinner was enjoyed by 54 attendees. Roughly 85 showed up to light the tree and enjoy the activities in the gym. The Branson trip went very well. A trip to Nashville is scheduled for the spring of 2023.
